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## 5 MPs Claim Their Names Included In Proposed Select Committee Without Consent

A probe has been ordered into the complaints of five MPs that their names were included in a proposed select committee of the House for the Delhi services bill without their consent.

The five MPs are: BJP's S Phangnon Konyak, Narhari Amin and Dr Sudhanshu Trivedi, AIADMK's MP M Thambidurai and BJD MP Dr Sasmit Patra. The select committee was proposed by Aam Aadmi Party leader Raghav Chadha in the Upper House to examine the Delhi services bill.

Responding to the claims of including their names without consent, AAP MP Raghav Chadha said, "I will give an answer to the Privileges Committee when they send a notice."

After the deputy chairman read out the names to be included in the proposed select committee, Home Minister Amit Shah informed that five members have complained that their names were included without their signatures in the

proposal moved by the AAP leader. He demanded that this issue be investigated. Terming it a breach of privilege of the House, Shah said the matter should be referred to the privileges committee.



"Who all have signed on their behalf is a subject of investigation," Shah said and requested the Chair to record the statements of the complainant members.

Shah also attacked the AAP alleging that the party was "committing fraud in parliamentary proceedings". "It's a very serious issue that the AAP leader who submitted the select committee notice included names of members from the ruling party BJP and BJD as well as AIADMK who did not

give their consent. It's equal to forging their signatures. The concerned members have given letters to the Chairman," Union Minister V Muraleedharan said. Sasmit Patra of the BJD, M

House, I heard that my name was mentioned in a resolution that was moved by Raghav Chadha. Without taking my prior consent my name can't be put in the resolution. I hope the Chairman of the House will take action. I have given a complaint. Obviously, this is a matter of privilege. All of us have filed our respective complaints," said BJD MP Dr Sasmit Patra. Chadha's amendment to send the contentious bill to a select committee was negated by a voice vote. The Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi Bill, 2023 seeks to replace an ordinance on the handling of transfers and postings of officials in the Delhi government. AIADMK MP M Thambidurai alleged his fake signature on the proposal was moved by AAP MP Raghav Chadha to send the Delhi Services Bill to the Select Committee. "I had not signed any document. Therefore, someone may have forged my signature," the AIADMK MP said.

The panel of three will be led by former Chief Justice of the Jammu and Kashmir High Court, Gita Mittal. Justices Shalini Joshi and Asha Menon will also be part of this committee. The monitoring of the CBI inquiry will be entrusted to Dattatray Padsalgikar.

Justice Gita Mittal: Gita Mittal became the first woman Chief Justice of the Jammu and Kashmir High Court in 2015. She is renowned for handling significant cases involving crimes against women. Her notable achievements include finding three convicts guilty in the Shakti

Justice Asha Menon: Retired from the Delhi

High Court in September 2022, Justice Menon had previously served as a District and Sessions Judge in south Delhi before her elevation to the Delhi High Court in May 2019. Throughout her 33-year career as a district judge, she held crucial judicial and administrative positions. Notably, she was the Member Secretary of the National Legal Services Authority in 2012, and her

efforts contributed to NALSA's representation of transgender persons before the Supreme Court, leading to the landmark recognition of the third gender. Dattatray

Padsalgikar: A 1982-batch former IPS officer, Padsalgikar's career largely involved the Intelligence Bureau (IB). In 2016, he was appointed the Mumbai Police Commissioner by then Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis. Padsalgikar later became the Director General of Police of Maharashtra and subsequently a Deputy Lokayukta of the state following his retirement in 2018. He was also designated Deputy National Security Advisor. Known for his role in counter-terrorism operations, he significantly contributed to gathering evidence against non-state actors in the 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks case. His practical approach was evident in approving a constable's proposal to modify police timings during his tenure as Mumbai Police Chief.

Justice Shalini Joshi:

Justice Joshi, who retired in February 2019, was elevated to the Bombay

High Court in 2015. She is

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
